The trustees of SaltMalawi are at present giving careful consideration to ways in which we can help further the work in Malawi. We are providing finance for 120 Bibles in the Chichewa language to be distributed among the local churches. This fairly small number reflects to some extent the low level of literacy in rural Malawi. Recipients of the Bibles will be asked to make a small contribution towards the

cost to ensure that they are valued.

We are also hoping to be able to help finance the better education of some of the children of the leaders plus some orphans.

And we are aiming to finance the provision of a number of bicycles and small motor bikes to help the local leaders to more easily visit the churches in their care.
